and cohos fishing station. The next application on the list was for Yu-kus-kum on Hanson Island: the Indians belonging to this Tribe had a handloggers' license, but aside from that a portion of the land covered by this application was apparently vacant, there being about 150 acres in a lapsed timber limit, of which about 20 acres would be cultivable land and the remainder rook. He recommended that old Timber Limit 24794, containing approximately 150 acres, be granted. The land covered by the Sak-pus-di-sile application had been alienated by Palp Lease, but in any event would be of elittle use to the Indiens or enyone else, for which reason he declined to endorse the application. Between that place and Karlukses Village, however, there were several small islands which he would recommend to be added to Karlukees Reserve; he thought that there were three of these small islands, the largest of about half an acre, lying to the east of Karlukees Villago.

Mr. Commissioner Shaw thought that the Commission might properly urge upon the Provincial Government that wherever there was an Indian graveyard, the land so utilised should not be alienated unless by arrangement with the interested Indians. The place known as Useg, covered by another application of this band, was upon Fulp Limit No. 251 and was a long occupied fishing station, where the Indians secured all varioties of salmon. The dog salmon in particular were plentiful in that river and he recommended that five pores be granted at a fishing station. He did not know of any better dog salmon stileem or station available to this Tribe. The application for Sagages, at Owatsi Lake he declined to support as that place was too for away and in any event the land had been alienated. He recommended that Swanson Island be thrown in with the reserves of this hand and not given to the Mahmahlillimilehe
