same, &c., &c., &c., being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker commanded the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod to proceed to the Legislative Assembly, and acquaint that House "It is His Excellency's pleasure they attend him immediately " in this House."

Who being come with their Speaker,

The Clerk of the Crown in Chancery read the Titles of the Bills to be passed severally as follow :-

"An Act to authorize the apprehension and detention until the eighth day of June, "one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, of such persons as shall be suspected of " committing Acts of hostility or conspiring against Her Majesty's Person and Government."

"An Act to protect the inhabitants of Lower Canada against lawless aggressions from Subjects of Foreign Countries at peace with Her Majesty."

To each of these Bills the Royal Assent was pronounced by the Clerk of this House in the words following: -- "In Her Majesty's name, His Excellency the Governor General doth assent to this Bill."

His Excellency the Governor General was pleased to retire, and the Legislative Assembly withdrew.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton, (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable Sir N F. Belleau.

The House adjourned until Monday next, at three o'clock in the afternoon.
