CAP. XXXII.

An Act to naturalize James Searle Mann.

[Passed April 17th, 1855.]

THEREAS James Searle Mann intends Preamble. taking up his permanent residence or . domicile within this Colony, and is therefore desirous of being naturalized, and has given satisfactory assurance that he is willing to assume all the duties and responsibilities which may attach to him in the character of a good and faithful subject of our Lady the Queen :-

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, that he, the oath of allesaid James Searle Mann, so soon after the passing of this Act as he shall take and subscribe the oath of allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Victoria and her successors, in manner prescribed in and by this Act, shall, within the limits of this Island, be and become, and be held and adjudged to be, a naturalized subject of Her Majesty, entitled to all the rights and privileges of such subjects as fully as the same rights and privileges can or may be conferred by the Legislature of this Island, and under or by virtue of the Act of the Imperial Parliaments passed in the tenth and eleventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "an Act for the naturalization of Aliens."

After taking giance, &c, James Searle Mann to become a naturalized subject and entitled to privileges be-longing to sub-jects, &c.
