Mr. Winsor gave notice that he should, to-morrow, move that a committee be appointed to examine the public accounts, to sit every day the House meets, from 10 to 12 o'clock, with liberty to send for persons and papers, and to report to the House.

Notice of bill to repeal seamen's relief act.

Mr. Winsor also gave notice that he should, to-morrow, move for leave to bring in a bill to repeal in part an act passed in the 6th year of the reign of his late Majesty William the Fourth, entitled "An act to provide for the relief of sick and disabled seamen, fishermen and other persons," and to authorize the appropriation of monies collected under the said act.
