Toronto, July 13.—Disturbances are
developing over the Gulf of St. Law-
rence and also over the western states.

mostly fine in all the provinces, but
showers have occurred in Alberta and
Manitoba, and there have been heavy
thunderstorms at a few points in
Ontario.

ITALIANS ADVANCE SLOWLY

By Special Wire to the Courier.

Geneva, via Paris, July 13.—The
Italians are advancing very slowly
lately. The task of breaking through
the natural Alpine fortresses is more
difficult, as the Austrians now have
been fully reinforced. One of the chief
difficulties the Italians are meeting
with is the destruction of the wire
entanglements in the mountain passes
by indirect artillery fire.

King Victor Emmanuel, who is in
the danger zone, watched the bom-
bardment of Malborghetto for an
hour.

According to an Innsbruck dispatch
the Germans are concentrating a new
army under command of General Lun-
dendorff in the vicinity of Munich. Its
destination is said to be Trent.

The Russians are returning about
6000 Italians who were held prisoners
in Galicia by the Austrians to Italy.
The men will be sent home by way
of Roumania.

As the Austrian airmen outnumber
the Italian airmen, France is sending
some of her aviators to Italy.

LOSS NOT SERIOUS
By Special Wire to the Courier.

Paris, July 13.—The loss of the
Souchez cemetery and adjacent trenches
by the French which was indicated
in the French official statement of
yesterday, while regrettable, does
not affect the principal defenses in
this region, according to French mili-
tary writers. It is a warning, however,
says Col. Rousset in the Petit Parisien
that will not be neglected. The Ger-
mans visibly are redoubting their ef-
forts to capture the French fortress
of Verdun. After the failure of their
plans in the forest of Argonne, they
are trying to concentrate attacks in
the Woëvre district to obtain the most
accessible parts of the citadel by at-
tempting to establish batteries with
the idea of reaching the city. The
outer works, however, in the opinion
of the French military officials are
solidly guarded and are equipped with
all means for reply.
