Messrs. Haultain & Cross have moved into their new offices recently vacated by the Canada Permanent Scarth street, opposite old city hall. These premises are well situated and the spacious rooms have been nicely renovated for the new occupants.

Malcolm King accompanied by his son, Alex. Mackenzie, left on Sunday evening for Woodstock, Ont., to visit his aged parents and to take a much needed rest. His sons, James and George will manage the farm, and John the garden and dairy during his absence.

Many of our prominent citizens are in Prince Albert this week attending the board of trade convention and the Masonic Grand Lodge, both functions being held in the Northern city. An extra car was attached to the north train Monday and three cars yesterday to accommodate the delegates.

About two o'clock on Monday a quantity of lime in storage for Ald. Gillespie in Smith & Ferguson's sheds, through having been wet set fire to the building and the brigade had a few busy minutes to protect the coal sheds on both sides. The total damage is less than \$1500. Ald. Gillespie lost about two cars of lime.

When the pressure was put on during the fire on Monday, as usual the water main on Dewdney burst and has since been flooding the street. This contract is a disgrace to the city. The work was done in the winter and the clay was not tamped and in places the pipe is almost exposed. When the pressure is put on the pipe necessary to put on the digging gang ardigles like a snake and it becomes a pile of the city's good money has been thrown away on the Dewdney street water main. This job is certainly a rebuke to the colossal folly of last year's council.

The unclaimed parcel sale of the Dominion Express Co. conducted here yesterday by Auctioneer J. K. McManis was a record sale of this kind, the total aggregating \$1,500. This is the first sale of this nature held here and the suckers bit freely. There were some snags, however, for instance Alex. Cohen got thirteen suit lengths for four dollars, whereas another fellow paid two-fifty for a box of pink pills. Some fellow from Quebec went without his Xmas box from home, for one parcel contained a bottle of eye whiskey, about four pounds of twist tobacco and a pair of homespun and hand knit socks. A crowd attended the sale and it took seven hours steady selling to dispose of the goods.

The remains of T. L. McMillan of Earl Grey were interred here last Thursday. Deceased was quite a young man and had friends in Regina. His two half brothers Messrs. Kennedy of Warman, and Texas and Farr, business partner of the deceased attended the funeral. A rather singular incident in connection with the death of this young man was that but a day before he was taken ill, he and Farr were talking about their friend R. Johnston who had lost his life in the Windsor hotel fire and Farr said to McMillan, "Tom if anything should happen either of us, we do not know anything about each other's relatives," and it was on this occasion that Farr was told by McMillan that he had a half brother in Warman and another in Texas. McMillan was taken ill the following day and died almost suddenly. Farr immediately wired the relatives who attended the funeral here on Thursday.

Ex-Chief Justice McGuire of Prince Albert is in the city for a few days. He attended the Knights of Columbus.

The home of Geo. S. Houston was struck with lightning on Saturday and some of the family received a severe shock.

There were no fatalities as a result of the wreck on the Arcola line when the passenger train blew off of the track during the storm.

PRINCE PASSES THROUGH

Prince Fushimi passed through here Monday in his special train furnished by the C.P.R. The company placed two new cars at the disposal of his excellency, and the train all through was the finest that ever crossed the continent. The company also had the principal depots decorated with Japanese colors. There was a big crowd at the station to see the royal party but no cheer escaped the lips of the people as the prince passed by; but then that is nothing, for we did not cheer when Prince Arthur was here, but he was given a good time just the same.
