Several Additional Ones to be Sent Out This Spring.

Commissioner for Agriculture Gave Valuable Information.

Department Asked to Import Seed Wheat for Farmers

The Agricultural Committee had another important meeting Monday morning when apple growing was the principal topic of discussion. Hon. Mr. Farris introduced the subject and gave a statement of the work done last year. There had been orchards set out in the following named places: Buctouche, James Barnes, M. P. P., proprietor: Sussex, H. N. Arnold; Jubilee, S. Z. Dickson; St. John, B. V. Millidge; Waweig, W. E. Armstrong: Florenceville; H. H. McCain; New Jerusalem, W. T. Inch; Upper Sheffield, Isaac Stephenson.
During the present season it is intended to plant orchards at Clair Station, Thomas Clair, M. P. P.; St. Leonard's, R. B. Violette: Andover, F. E. Henderson; New Denmark, Wm. Johnson; Queensbury, Barry I. Whitehead; North Tetagouche, P. J. Power; Chatham, R. A. Murdoch; Doaktown, Wm. Murray; Golden Grove, W. R. McPate and Cnipman, Senator King. The varieties of fruit planted free Fameuse, Melntosh Red, Wolfe River, Baxter (or La Rue) Arctic, Wealthy, Duchess (or New Brunswicker) Milwankee, Stark, Ben Davis. In the southern part of the province Greening is used instead of Duchess. After the trees have become well started, in three or four years, it is intended to top graft Bishop Pippin and other soft varieties, which do not do well when planted but grow to perfection when grafted upon a hardy root. Plum trees are set out between the apple trees at first, the varieties being Imperial Gage, Lombard, Yellow Eye and Hawkeye. The plum tree matures much more rapidly than the apple, and is not long lived, so that by the time the apple tree matures, in about fifteen years, the plum tree is taken out. Fifty apple trees are planted to an arce: The seedlings are obtained from Ontario. An application had been received for an illustration orchard in connection with the Kingston Consolidated School, where they have half an acre of ground, and the department would set this orchard out this spring as it was thought to be most desirable and would afford the scholars attending that school a fine opportunity to get practical knowledge upon the subject of orchard culture.

Secretary Peters gave a lot of information to the committee regarding the detail work of the orchards. He visits them personally and plants the trees, the owner having previously prepared the ground. The owner enters into an agreement to care for the orchard for ten years as directed by the Department and at the end of that time the property is his, and he also has whatever fruit is raised in the meantime. It is intended to carry on these orchards as experiments and for that reason some sites thought to be undesirable have been chosen. It is claimed, for instance, that apples cannot be successfully grown in the northern part of the province, and the Department wishes to test the matter in a practical way. The owner is given instruction in cultivating the ground between the trees, regarding spraying, pruning, grafting and in fact is taught how to raise fruit as done in Nova Scotia and Ontario. It has been demonstrated that New Brunswick can produce as fine apples as are grown anywhere and it is believed that fruit growing can be made as profitable and successful in this province as it is in Nova Scotia.

Hon. Mr. Farris referred to the criticisms that had been made in the committee regarding the Campbellton grist mill and read a letter from Mr. Doherty, the proprietor, in which he claimed that the mill was in constant operation and the wants of patrons are promptly attended to. He said that some farmers had taken their grists to a Quebec mill to have ground for the purpose of seeing which mill produced the best flour, but they are coming back to the Campbellton mill. Hon. Mr. Labillois said that the question of wheat growing was an important one on the north shore, where very little dairying is carried on. He thought the Department take into consideration some system of assisting the farmers with seed wheat furnished through the Agricultural Societies. This was unanimously adopted.
