Cascapedia for instance, having made arrangements with the steam boat owners ahead, have got off the train at Bathurst and gone across the Bay from here, thus gaving at least a day which is quite a consideration to busy men to whom every day of their holidays count.

It seems to us if this method of reaching the Quebec side of the Bay was always available and was advertised nearly all the tourists from the States who go there during the summer season would be only too glad to take advantage of it. On Saturday last two gentlemen from Boston who were on their way to Bonaventure, learning that they could reach their river by this means, made arrangement by wire, and getting off at Bathurst were soon on their way by steamer.

During the past week great numbers of grilse have appeared in the Nepisiguit and other North Shore rivers, and the anglers are having good sport with these little fish on light rods. In this connection we are glad to notice that nearly all American anglers are discarding heavy tackle and taking up the use of smaller rods. Years ago even eighteen foot rods were thought none too heavy for salmon fishing. Now one seldom sees a rod of more than tifteen feet used and many anglers prefer rods of thirteen or fourteen feet, finding they can kill the heaviest fish with light tackle, as long as their lines are of sufficient length and their leaders are reliable.
