

Local and other Items.

The Addie, Captain Penny left for Bridgewater, on the 19th, in ballast.

The Cromwell steamer Cortes, from New York and Halifax, arrived at St. John's on Wednesday last.

The crew of the ill-fated schooner Lizzie, Captain Talbot, and owned by John Rorke, arrived here yesterday.

The Aurora, Captain Tizzard, left this port on the 18th inst., in ballast, for LaHave.

The Muriel, Captain Rorke, left here for Gibraltar on the 16th inst., with cargo of fish.

The Elizabeth Jane, Captain Kennedy, left for Sydney, in ballast, on the 14th inst.

Duff & Balmer's schooner Henry West, Captain Kielly, left this port on the 19th inst., to prosecute the Bank fishery.

We are pleased to note that a very fine schooner is being built by C. Dawe, Esq., Bay Roberts. Two schooners are also being built at Spauld's Bay for the Labrador fishery.

Mr. Davis, Superintendent of the Methodist Grammar School, Brigades have been here spending his Easter holidays with his friend Mr Magarity Superintendent of the Carbonar Methodist Grammar School.

We were visited yesterday by two young lads, who informed us that they belonged to Lower Island Cove, and they had not eaten anything for several days. They are informed that there were several families in that neighborhood in a very advanced state of hunger.

The Isabella Ridley, Capt Thomey arrived at Harbor Grace from the real fishery this morning. She reports seeing the Creole, Captain Pike, on Monday last, near the Punks. A man named Maddocks, one of the crew of the above named vessel, blew off his thumb while in the act of firing a gun.

Late advices from the westward speak of three or four hundred seals having been taken in punts and otherwise by the people about Channel and that neighborhood. We also learn that people of Twillingate and places adjacent have had similar good luck.—Nfldr.

Intelligence having lately reached here that small pox is prevalent in New York, we learn that the Government have directed that the Quarantine regulations be enforced regarding vessels arriving here from the United States. There can be no question of the wisdom and necessity of this measure of precaution against the most fearful epidemics. We have no doubt all possible vigilance will be exerted on the sanitary authorities and those under their direction to ward off a visitation of the disease.—Ibid.
