GET ON LAND EARLY

The Dates to Plant for Heaviest Yields.

To Make Most Money From Wool Shearing has to be Done Properly and Wool Handled Carefully—A Few Hints Which Have Saved Farmers Dollars.

It will be seen that the spring wheat gives decidedly the best returns from the first date of seeding.

Sheep Shearing. Shearing and Tying the Fleece—Shearing should only be carried on under the most favorable conditions.

Dung Loads of Tags—It will be noticed with many fleeces that there are certain hard dung locks or tags adhering to the britch ends.

Rolling the Fleece—Spread the fleece out on the floor, being careful not to pull apart with the teeth.

Try the Fleece—Having rolled tightly, tie both ways with the special paper twine supplied by the Department.

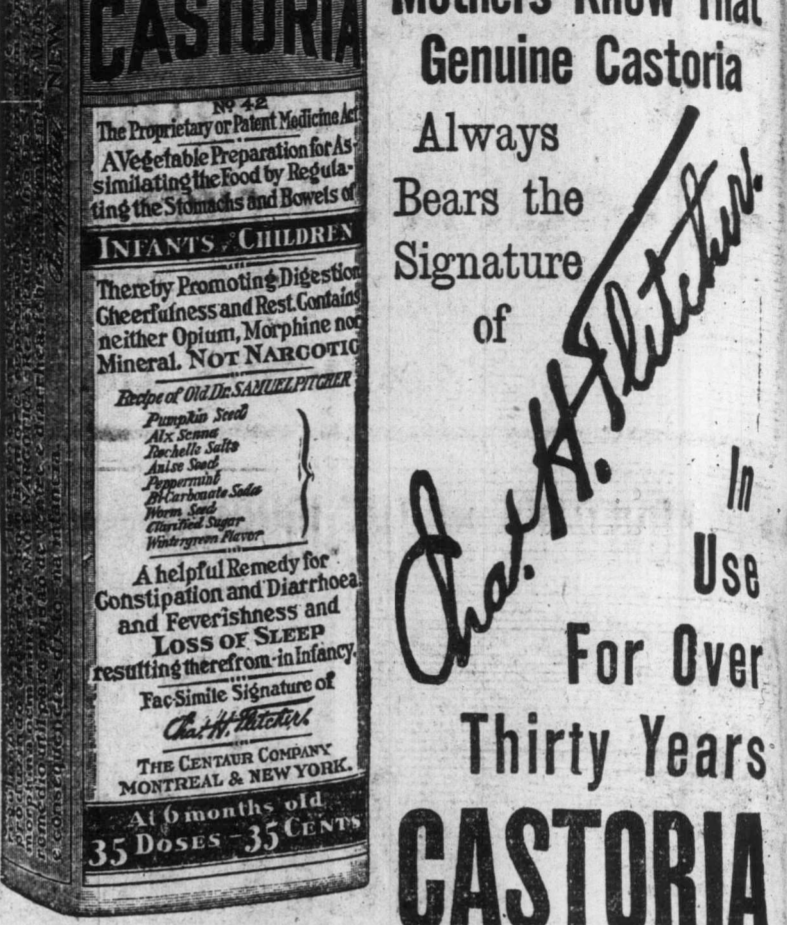

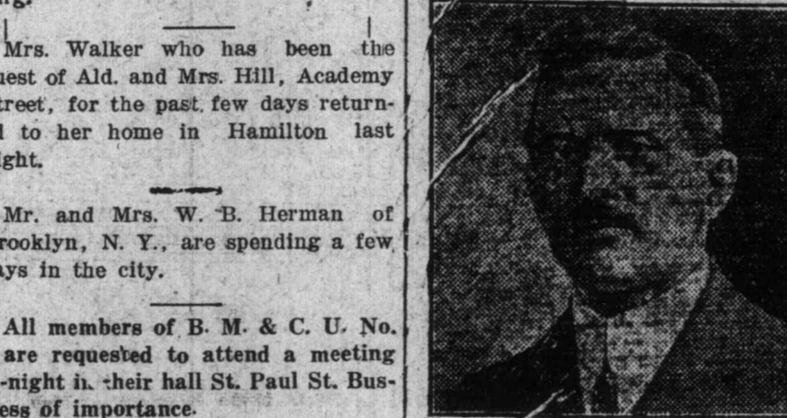
