LONDON, Nov. 22. The Irish Free State Constitution bill passed the second reading in the House of Commons by an unanimous vote.

The resolutions of the United Fishermen were adopted after being read by the Chairman. These resolutions, calling for reduced public expenditure, reduction of taxation, and an early summoning of the Legislature for business, were strongly endorsed by the Chairman and seconded by Mr. William Hiscock in an admirable address.
