HORRIBLE ABORTION CASE

FRIGHTFUL DOINGS OF A DRUNKEN PHY-SICIAN IN GEORGETOWN-CORONER'S

From the Toronto Telegraph.

Georgetown, Nov. 12.—One of the most horrible affairs that we have every heard of occurred in this town yesterday, and is now the universal topic of conversation. The facts of the case, as elicited at the Coroner's inquest, are as follows;—

John Vance, a blacksmith here, at the request of his wife called upon Dr. McConnell a short time ago for the purpose of getting medicine to procure an abortion. The doctor gave him a prescription which was made up by a druggist in town. The medicine, however, failed to produce the desired result. Vance went again to the doctor, told him of the failure of the medicine, and requested him to come with him to his wife. The doctor lives in Cheltenham, and while driving from that place to here, they drank so may times that the doctor became considerably under the influence of liquor.—On arriving here they went to a druggist and procured some medicine, after which they went to Vance's house. Mrs. Vance was preparing supper when they arrived. She was in excellent health, but for some unknown reason she was opposed to having any more children and it was at here
