The London Canadian News, of the 18th ult., says that, "it is informed," oubtless by the "delegates themselves," that Sir George Cartier and the Hon. Wm. McDougall are arranging for their early return to Canada, it being expected that the Dominion Parliament will be shortly summoned for the despatch of business. Some further progress has been made in the Hudson Bay Company's tiations, the delegates having se in to Lord Granville their paper in regard to the claims of the company, as set forth in their recent reply to terms of settlement proposed by the Duke of Buckingham. This paper, we understand completely disposes, from the delegates' point of view, of the "territorial rights" claims to the company which are charcterised as being utterly untenable, and it concludes with the hope that Her Majesty's Government will now take the necessary steps to transfer Rupert's Land to the Dominion, subject to whatever rights the company may be able to estab lish, in the terms of the address of Canadian Parliament of last session.






