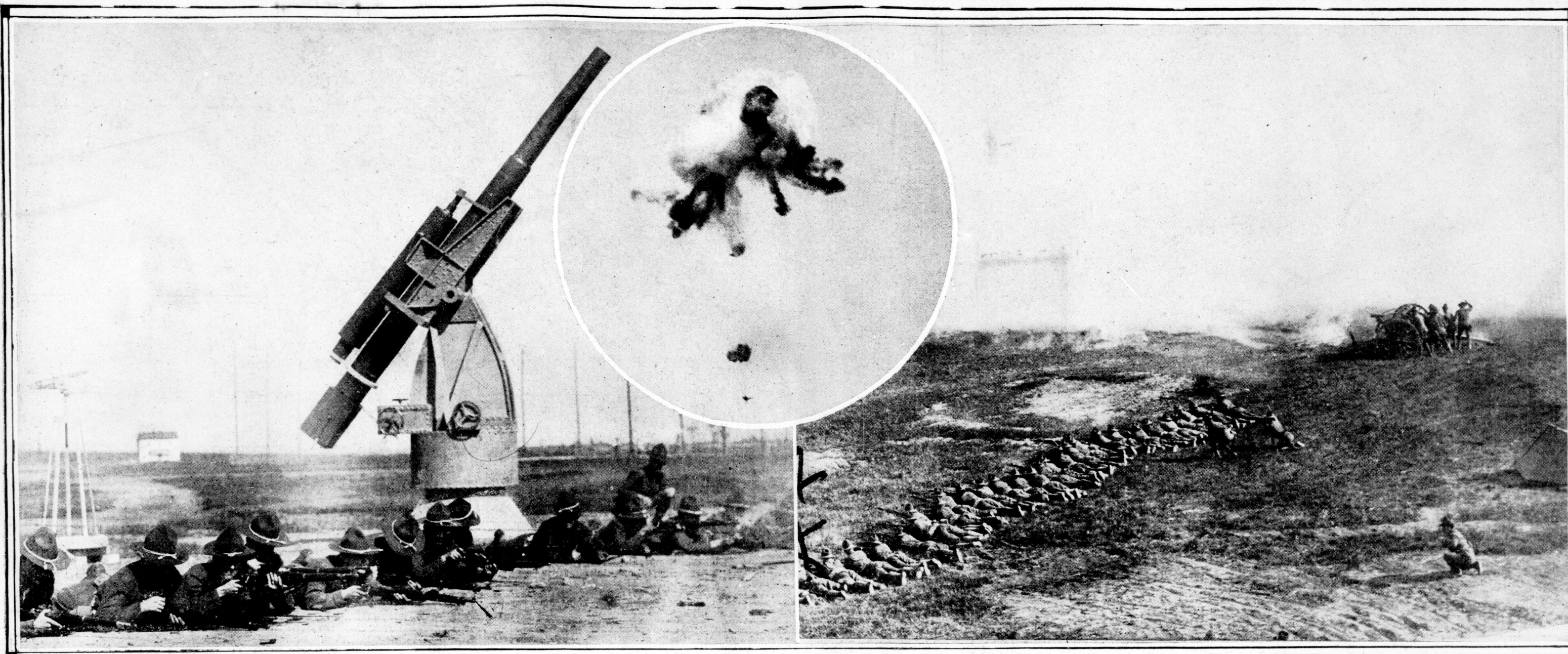

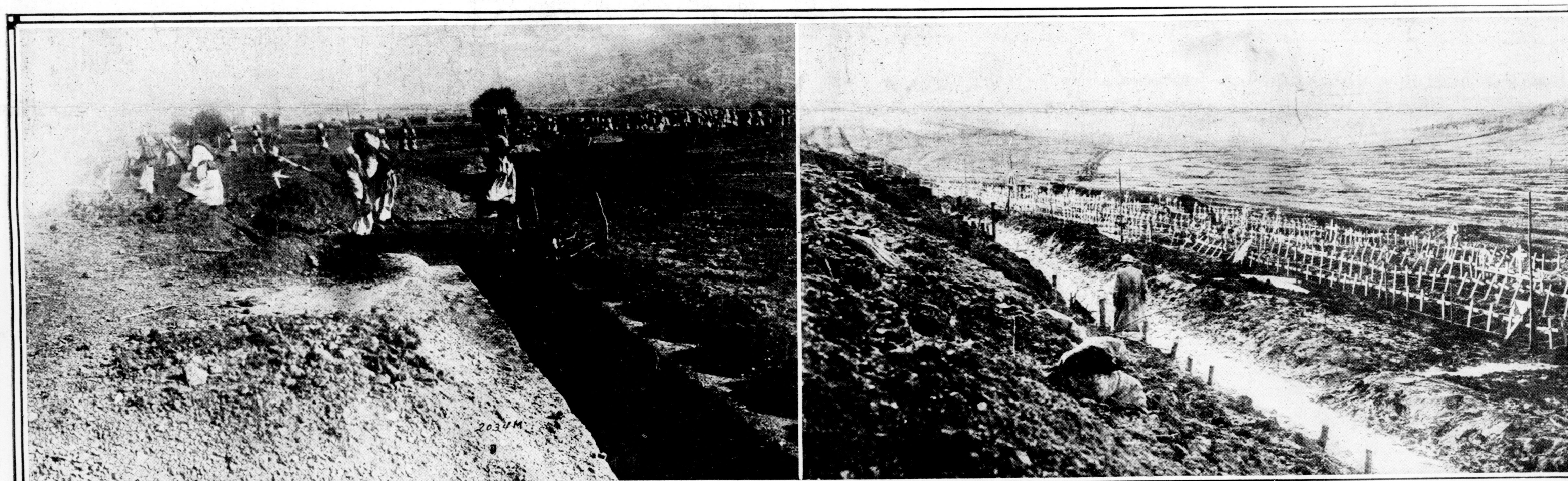

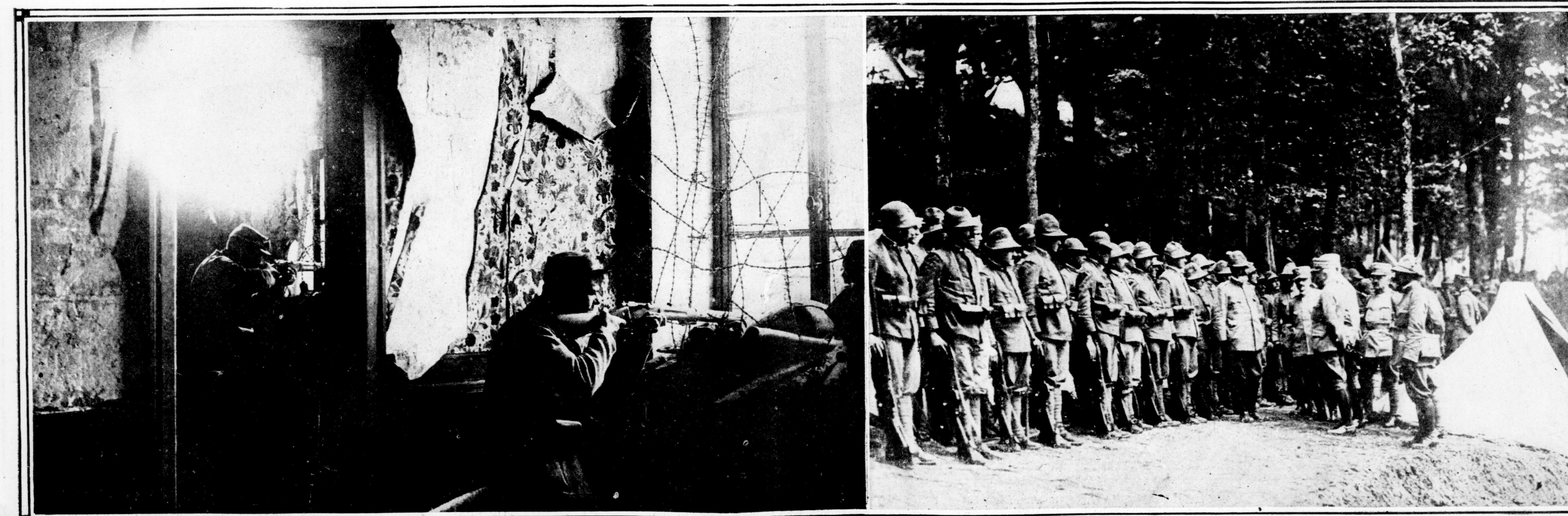
BATTLE SCENE AT THE MILITARY TOURNAMENT AT SHEEPSHEAD BAY SPEEDWAY

This is the first photograph of Africans in actual charge in the Plains of Alsace. In the background are seen the snowy peaks of the Alsatian Alps.

Thousands of the French dead are buried here at the foot of "Les Espagnes" Hill, the scene of so many bloody fights during the war. The little creek that flows by here has been the scene of so many bloody conflicts that the French soldiers have nicknamed it Le Ruisseau Rouge (The Red Creek).
