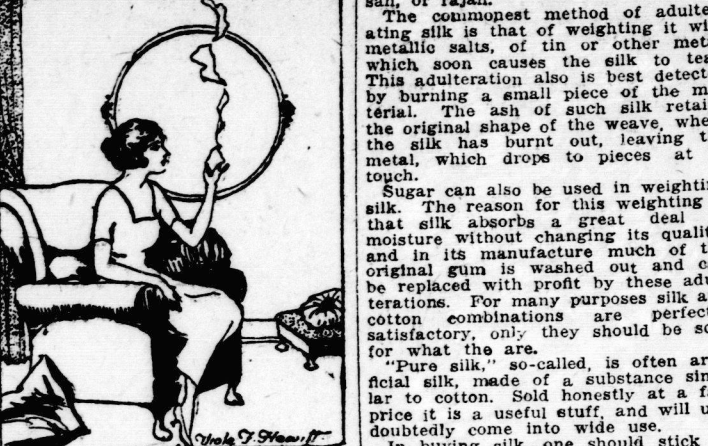

The Bubble of Proof.

Under the title, "Proof that Cold Does Cause 'Colds,'" an article apparently manufactured by a staff man on the London Advertiser, has been clipped and mailed to me by no less than fourteen readers.

The "proof" that cold does cause "colds" whatever they may not be credited to the New York Medical Journal, a fine old medical periodical with a fine old medical way. On referring to the medical periodical I find that the "proof" consists of a paragraph in an editorial item on "Cold and Respiratory Diseases," in which some Paris mortality statistics compiled by one Louis Besnon are referred to.

Just to show how similar is the old medical reasoning to the too popular deductions and the notions on this particular subject, I will quote this paragraph:

"Louis Besnon has compiled the mortality statistics in Paris from bronchitis, lobar and bronchial pneumonia, so-called congestion of the lungs and other respiratory affections except phthisis (tuberculosis), by weeks, covering a period of ten years, from 1904 to 1913, and compared these with meteorological conditions, especially temperature and wind direction. He finds the minimum deaths from these diseases in the first week of September, and the maximum in the second week of February, with a secondary rise near the middle of April. The number of deaths corresponds closely with the temperature, the effect of the latter being increased especially by winds from the northeast. As might be expected, the highest death tolls three weeks behind the lowest temperature and most marked influence of air movement. At 20 degrees Centigrade (68 degrees F.)—perhaps the Centigrade is used to impress the reader that this is a strictly scientific editorial comment, for all its old-fashionedness—the deaths were 81, at 50 degrees F. they were 74, while at 32 degrees F. they were 22. At 22 degrees F. they were 230. At 68 F. a fire would hardly be needed, but at both 50 and 32 F.

It is a wise plan to discharge your doctor the moment you feel you know more than he knows about the proper treatment, and employ one who commands your confidence.

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FLEMING HAS NO SYMPATHY WITH PEELEE PLANTS

Declares Plenty of Gravel Is Being Left At Point.

[Special To The Advertiser.] WINDSOR, June 27.—There is enough gravel at Point Pelee to build and maintain roads in this part of the province for the next hundred years, said O. E. Fleming, K.C., today, regarding charges that Point Pelee is being sucked into the lake, and gravel is being used to build up American cities.

"The people who are protesting are the ones who endeavored to secure rights to dredge for gravel themselves and failed," said Mr. Fleming.

Tonight a delegation from Windsor and other municipalities of the county left for Toronto where it will have an interview with Hon. F. C. Biggs, minister of highways, tomorrow, in an effort to have work on the provincial highway in Essex County resumed.

Members from the southern part of the county will interview Hon. W. E. Ramey, attorney-general, it is expected, in regard to the alleged damage which the sand-suckers are doing Point Pelee.

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
