

PROVINCE MOVES TO SAVE \$100,000

Department of Highways Will
Ask Resignation of Many
Engineers.

REORGANIZE SYSTEM

Canadian Press Despatch.
Toronto, Jan. 10.—Hon. George S.
Henry, Ontario minister of public
works, has called for the resignation

of 55 per cent of the department's employ, it was announced today. The plan would consist of reducing the number of units into which the province is divided for road administration. At present there is a chief engineer, an assistant to him, and three divisional engineers in charge of all highways. Each divisional engineer, however, has the district under his jurisdiction subdivided into subordinate "residencies." Each residency has its own local office, an engineer in charge, and two or three juniors who are qualified engineers, and receive remuneration as such. The residencies are to be reduced from 25 to 12 in number.

MEXICAN REBELS CAPTURE PACHUSA

Government Despatches 2,000
Federals To Repel Invading
Insurgents.

EXPECT BIG BATTLE

Mexico City, Jan. 10.—The capture
this morning of Pachuca, capital and
most important mining town in the
northern state of Hidalgo, by rebellious

forces under Generals Marcela Cava-
zos, Nicolas Flores and Otilio Villa-
gas, was confirmed at noon today by
the war department.
The rebels will attempt to hold the
city, which is 55 miles northeast of
the capital, as 2,000 federal troops
from Mexico City have been sent to
Pachuca to surround the invaders.
The federal columns commanded by
General Pausto Aopete and Juan An-
drew Almazan today began their ad-
vance toward Vera Cruz against the
rebels. The columns comprised all
elements necessary to meet the De
La Huerta forces. The expectation is
that the federal forces will come in
contact with the rebels at Jalapa.

HOUSE ADJOURNS UNTIL NEXT WEEK

Swearing In Members of New
Parliament Completed With-
out Further Incident.

London, Jan. 10.—The work of
swearing in the members of the new
parliament was completed today with-
out further incident, and the house
adjourned until next Tuesday, when
the ceremony of opening in state will
occur.
A cabinet council was in session for

more than two hours, and the speech
from the throne to be delivered at
the state opening was drafted. Its
terms were kept secret, but it is said
to have been decided that the speech
will only refer to the policy of tariff
protection as having been rejected by
the electorate. It will propose, how-
ever, to go on with the preference
duties promised to the British Do-
minions.

LIQUOR IMPORTATION RIGHT STILL SOUGHT

Toronto Man Carries Fight
Against O. T. A. To
Supreme Court.

Toronto, Jan. 10.—John T. Smith,
who insists that he is entitled to im-
port liquor into Ontario, has failed
in his action against the attorney-
general of Ontario, both before Mr.
Justice Orde and the first division
court, but another appeal is now on

its way to the supreme court of
Canada.
Smith wants it declared that the
resolution passed by the Ontario
Legislature to the effect that the
province was a "prohibition" one,
was untrue, and he seeks a declara-
tion that "Ontario at the time of the
resolution was not a province in
which there was in force a law pro-
hibiting the sale of intoxicating
liquors."
