PROVINCE VS. C. P. E.

Following is the full text of the judgment of Chief Justice Baggin in the suit of the Province against the C. P. E. to recover the amount of the bond, \$250,000, given as a guarantee for the extension of the line from Port Moody to Coal River within a given period.

This is an action against the defendants for the non-performance of the contract entered into between the Province and the C. P. E. on November 18, 1885, the condition being broken. That condition was that the defendants should carry out and complete all the terms in an agreement of the 23rd February, 1885. One of those terms was that the Company were to complete the extension of their main line as therein mentioned beyond their western terminus (located to be then fixed at Fort Moody), and that such extension should be fully and completely completed on or before the 31st December, 1887.
