A BATTLE OF GIANTS
(Toronto Globe)

Technicians and mechanics in the United States are talking of the contest between the steam locomotive and the electric locomotive at the Erie Works of the American General Electric Company the other day. It is described as a battle of giants, each being the mightiest of its kind. The electric monster was one of ten 2,700-horsepower engines, being built for the Mexican Railway, and the steam rival was one of the most powerful Mikado-type freight locomotives of the New York Central. A four mile track was laid and the two behemoths were coupled together to lead a Power contest. The test was repeated several times with the same result. Another type of electric locomotive won the speed demonstration, with a record of 106 miles an hour.

The electric locomotive had already been proved, especially in the mountainous sections of the United States, where it carries loads of water power is not too distant. 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CURE FOUND FOR
DREADED LEPROSY

So Says the Superintendent of
Institution at Tracadie,
N. B.

Ottawa, Jan. 17.—In a report to the federal department of health, Dr. J. A. Langie, superintendent of the Leprosy institution at Tracadie, N. B., expresses the conviction that the causal agent of leprosy is a bacterium, and that the treatment developed by modern medical science is a cure for the dread malady.

Canada has two leprosy stations, one at Tracadie, N. B., and the other at D'Arcy Island, B. C. The medical officer at D'Arcy Island reports steady improvement in the condition of the five patients under his care; where the oil treatment is also employed. He acknowledges the courtesy of American health officers in Honolulu, who furnish the preparation free of charge. The five patients at D'Arcy Island are Chinese, and in addition, a Russian afflicted with the disease is receiving treatment at the William Head quarantine station.

At the close of the fiscal year eleven patients were under care at Tracadie, six men and five women. One new case, a Chinese, whose trouble was diagnosed in a Montreal hospital, was admitted during the period dealt with in the report. Seven of the patients are French-Canadian natives of Tracadie and surrounding country, one is a Chinese, one an Indian, one of French and Scotch descent and one a Chinese. No deaths occurred at the station during the year.

HEALTH RECORDS
SHOW IMPROVEMENT

Every Birth Should be Recorded
in Fairness to Child—
Increase Shown

Few things are of more importance in the life of a child than the registration of its birth with the government authorities. The Department of Health has this work in charge and last year succeeded in registering the births of over 11,000 children born in New Brunswick. This was the largest number of births registered in one year per head of population in the registration area in Canada.

The department wishes to do as well this year and every year—that is, it is anxious that not a single birth occur without being duly registered. There is an official called the sub-registrar who goes into every parish, town and city in New Brunswick. He will supply anyone who makes application to him with a blank certificate of registration and this certificate when filled in can be returned to him free of postage if marked "Vital Statistics" with the name and address of the registrar.

These certificates are most carefully filed with the Department and certified copies of them can be obtained at any time they may be required. A dozen other most useful purposes.

To know the birth-rate, moreover of any parish, town or province is one of the most important advantages possible in reducing the death rate and in controlling preventable sickness. G. G. M.

CONVICTIONS UNDER LIVE
STOCK PRODUCTS ACT

"You will be fined \$5.00 and costs in each case or 10 days hard labour and if you come up here again for putting out bad eggs for sale you will not get any fine, you will go to jail for a long term." These were the words of a Cambridge magistrate last week in convicting 21 Moreau for offering eggs for sale that were unfit for food, and the offering for sale of eggs which were not marked, or improperly marked, according to the "Regulations Governing the Marking and Grading of Eggs."

A Dominion Egg Inspector before the court said that this man had been warned seventeen times. On one occasion the inspector found 5 dozen and 8 eggs offered for sale labelled "fresh-laid." These graded 2 dozen and 3 firsts, 2 dozen and 4 very poor seconds and 8 rots.

Similar charges were also made on the same day against Rodnucky & Co., and Vainberg & Co. In each instance there were several charges against the defendants, the magistrates inflicting fines of \$5.00 and costs on each charge.

The egg regulations under the "Live Stock and Live Stock Products Act 1923" have been effective since last July, and although many infractions of this law have been made unconsciously, or under misunderstanding of its meaning, it is now being made evident that the Dominion Department of Agriculture is not prepared to excuse violations indefinitely. A Polyglot Porter

THE smooth-working organism of a great railway which prides itself on being able to meet any situation in an equable manner, received a rude jolt one day when two picturesquely garbed strangers strolled into the Windsor Depot of the Canadian Pacific Railway at Montreal, and, despite the most elaborate and courteous linguistic contrivances, failed in a most deplorable manner to make anyone understand what they wanted.

Someone who had travelled in the east ventured the opinion that they were Arabs, and the polyglot porter, though he does not speak a word of Arabic, was in progress of making a list of the stock of available languages for the purpose of satisfying his curiosity. 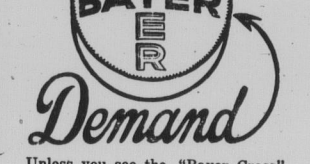

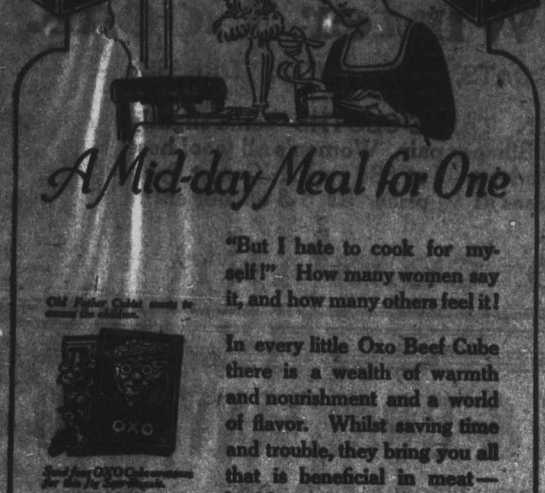
