WEST TORONTO JUNGTION CHEAP LANDS.

The Plans of the Credit Valley and ontario Railrond-A New Depot, Hotel and Dining Rooms to be Erected. Last Monday morning The World gave brief account of the progress made in the laying of the West Toronto Junction's chesp acds for the many. During the present week immense progress has been made with the grading and laying out of the streets property, and all sign-boards the location of the diferected stakes for cellars, and several piles of lumber are lying in different directions, mark-

ing the early erection of the long felt want of cheap homes at the Toronto Junction, of the most surprising facts in connection with this property is that \$150,000 of real estate around the junction has changed blocks of from \$250 to \$500 per acre, as high as \$1000 per acre having, in some instances, been paid for blocks of this propup in building lots and sold to ready cus tomers who have, in many instances, built fine residences upon them. On Dundat street nearly the entire number of front lots have been sold, upon which contracts have been made to build stores immediately.
