THE DRILL COMPANIES' REVIEW.

An immense throng witnessed the Evolutions of the Public School Pupils on the Normal School Grounds.

Hundreds of citizens turned out yesterday afternoon to witness the review of the public school drill companies at the Normal School grounds. The review was to have taken place at the time of the unveiling of the Sir John A. Macdonald memorial, but was postponed until yesterday.

Companies commenced to arrive at the grounds at 3 o'clock, and for the next half hour there appeared to be a steady stream of youthful soldiers coming around every corner of the square.
