McLachlan. Death of Mr. Arch. McLachlan. Another of Plympton's most highly respected pioneers passed away on Mon-day, March 11th, in the person of Arch. McLachlan, of Kertch. Although the late Arch. McLachlan has been ill for years the news of his death was a sur-prise to his many friends. He was in his Soth year having been born in Argyl-shire, Scotland in 1833. He came to Canada in 1836 with his parents, the late Mr. and Mrs. John McLachlan, who settled in Lobo. After learning his trade of blacksmithing he removed to Kertch fifty-two years ago where he continued his trade until health failed him. He leaves behind him to mourn his death bis wife and many relatives among which are five sisters. Mrs. Geo. Minielly, of Plympton; Mrs. Neil Mc-Vicar and Mrs. John McCoubrey, of Brooke; Mrs. Alex. Sinclair, of Lobo, and Mrs. A. McMurphy, of London, and a brother Dan McLachlan, who still lives on the old homestead in Lobo. The remains were interred in Wyoming Cemetery on Wednesday, March 13th, the services being conducted by Rev. G. W. Rošs, assisted by Rev. Mr. Reid.
