Below will be found the rules of the exchange department, and members shall be governed thereby, and avoid mistakes.

I.—Scott's latest catalogue shall be the basis of exchange.

II.—All stamps must be mount-

ed in the special prepared book of the association. These books will be supplied on application to the exchange superintendent at a nominal cost of 5c each.

III.—As soon as members are supplied with books they shall mount stamps securely and forward by mail to the exchange superintendent registered.

IV.—Books must not be kept longer than three days. Members not observing this rule shall be fined 3c per day.
