IRON AND HARDWARE.—Pig iron is dull and nominally unchanged. Warrants are called weak at 41 1/2, a decline of 60 during two weeks.

LUMBER.—Laths are lower at \$1.75, owing to the arrival of new stock. The export trade continues fair.

LEATHER.—Choice heavy bluff is scarce, with sales at higher prices, including a lot of 100 sides at 17c.

CHEMICALS.—Round amounts of soda ash have been placed at 90c to 95c, while small spot lots are at \$1 to \$1.10.

GRAIN.—In the sugar market yellows range from 5 1/2c to 6 1/2c to quality, and granulated from 8 1/2c to 9c.

NAVAL STORES.—Rosin—Common strained \$2.50, and the range is from that up to \$5 for fine clear white.

CITY BREADSTUFFS, DAIRY PRODUCE AND PROVISIONS.

The principal feature of the flour market yesterday was inactivity. Values are unchanged. The only reported sale is 125 bbls. fine at \$9.50.

THE CATTLE MARKETS.

Cattle freights are quoted at \$2.25 to \$3. Some original contracts, made at 14c, are now being carried out, but no new contracts can now be made exceeding 14c.
