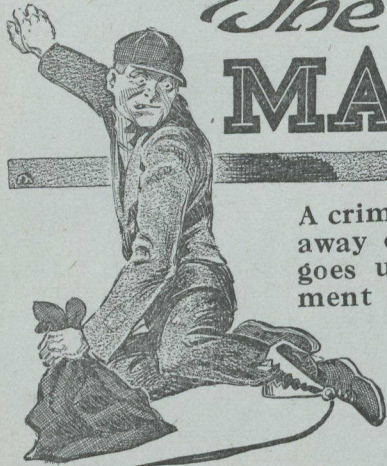

POLICE SIGNAL SYSTEM PROVES SUCCESSFUL

That the local police signal system is a most useful accessory to the local force, was proved recently when constable Gorman made his sensational capture of Edward Monette who was found guilty of the purse snatching, at 1845 Mrs. E. A. "in" the castle, who was the victim of the theft, phoned to the police office giving a description of the man who had just taken her purse. Inside of three minutes this description had been phoned to every constable on duty. At 11 o'clock the man had been captured and was locked in the station cell.

All this through the signal system, which was installed in 1912 by the Northern Electric Co. It comprises twelve boxes at various points throughout the city. Each box is equipped with a telephone, a light and a bell.

Each man flags up headquarters every time he passes a box. In the winter the relative requires the year, with date, time and number of the signal on duty enters the record book.
