AMBASSADORS AND HIGH COMMISSIONERS POSTED ABROAD

Atlanta: Geoffrey Elliot as Consul General in Atlanta. Mr. Elliot joined the Department of Trade and Commerce in 1966. He has served abroad as Counsellor (Commercial) in London. Since 1983, he has been Chief Air Negotiator.

Costa Rica: Stanley E. Gooch as Ambassador. Mr. Gooch joined the Department of External Affairs in 1966. He has served abroad in Buenos Aires, Belgrade, and as Counsellor in Vienna. Since 1983, he has been Director, United States Transboundary Division.

Cuba: Michael Kergin as Ambassador. Mr. Kergin joined the Department of External Affairs in 1967. He has served abroad in Yaounde, Washington, Santiago, and as Counsellor Permanent Mission of Canada to the United Nations, New York. Since 1985, he has been Senior Departmental Assistant to the Secretary of State for External Affairs.

Denmark: Dorothy J. Armstrong as Ambassador. Ms. Armstrong joined the Department of External Affairs in 1957. She has served abroad in New Delhi, Paris (OECD) and Bonn. She was Ambassador to Hungary. Since 1983, she has been Director, Commonwealth Division.

Detroit: Marc C. Lemieux as Consul General. Mr. Lemieux joined the Trade Commissioner Service, Department of Trade and Commerce, in 1967. He has served abroad in Hong Kong and Dallas, and as Consul General in Rio de Janeiro. Since 1984, he has been Ambassador to Ethiopia.
