PRAYERS.

One Petition was laid on the Table.

Mr. MacLaren, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General, Annual Report of the Department of Pensions and National Health, the Board of Pension Commissioners for Canada, the Pension Tribunal, the Pension Appeal Court and the War Veterans Allowance Committee, for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1932.

Sir George Perley, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 14th October, 1932, for a copy of all telegrams, letters, correspondence and other documents exchanged between Mr. Castonguay or any member of his staff in connection with the dismissal of C. A. Goyette, K.C., returning officer in Ste. Marie, Montreal.

And also,—Return to an Order of the House of the 17th October, 1932, for a copy of the Quebec Postal District superintendent's answer to the letter of the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission, dated January 18, 1932, P.O. 34985, page 5 of the Order of the House No. 112, tabled April 22, 1932, in connection with the application of Joseph Arthur Morin, a veteran of the Great War, for the position of postmaster at St. Joseph d'Alma, Quebec.

Mr. Rhodes, a Member of the King's Privy Council, for Mr. Gordon, laid before the House,—Copies of Orders in Council passed under the Provision of the Unemployment and Farm Relief Continuance Act, 1932, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 2312, dated 19th October, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Quebec of \$3,458.42 for direct relief and \$55,624.71 for public works and undertakings.

Order in Council, P.C. 2313, dated 19th October, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Quebec of \$2,597.62 for direct relief.
