## Supply

Loans to New Brunswick Electric Power Commission in connection with the operation of a nuclear generating station at Point Lepreau, New Brunswick.

An agreement reached between New Brunswick and the federal Government provides a series of standby loans to New Brunswick Power in the event that the Point Lepreau nuclear reactor fails to provide an adequate amount of electricity. The agreement provides that New Brunswick Power can receive up to \$6 million per year maximum in the event that Point Lepreau's power production is less than 75 per cent of capacity.

When the Supplementary Estimate was drawn up, the Department assumed that the maximum amount for the year would be called upon. In fact, while the reactor missed its October start-up date, and only started producing at full power in March, the reactor has behaved very well since. Thus New Brunswick Power is only able to call upon a total of \$3.8 million.

New Brunswick Power has indicated in writing to the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources that it has no intention of seeking any funds for the current year. It is also worth noting that when called, New Brunswick Power knew nothing of this Supplementary Estimate.

## • (1900)

Since the fund has been called upon to the extent I just indicated, we had no choice but to support concurrence in the estimate itself. But it is evidence of a sloppiness in the preparation of the estimate, particularly in the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources where they would be calling for substantial moneys over and above those actually needed.

We are therefore supporting the Schedule, but now that these remarks are on the record the Department will likely take note and rectify things in the future.
