5. Whether the parties responsible for the representations or requests were consulted and their approval of the plans secured before this construction was commenced.

6. How tenders were called.

7. Who tendered and for what price.

8. Who the successful tenderer was.

9. What the price was.

10. What moneys have been paid to them to date.

11. Whether there were any extras. If so, what they were and what they cost.

12. Whether any work was done for private interests in the port of Quebec last fall.

13. If so, for whom and what amount was paid by these private interests for the services rendered by this boat.

14. Upon whose request this boat was transferred to the port of St. John last fall and for what purpose.

15. While at St. John whether any work was done for private interests.

16. If so, for whom, what payments were made by these private interests and to whom the moneys were paid.

17. Upon whose request the boat was brought back to the port of Quebec this spring, 1933.

18. For what purpose it was brought back.

19. Whether the Department of Marine or the Government has made any arrangements, tacit or otherwise, to do work for private interests in the port of Quebec.

20. If so, what they are—viz—for whom and what consideration.

21. Whether the Government has gone into the towing business.

22. If so, for what reason.

Mr. Gordon, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Annual Report of the Department of Immigration and Colonization, for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1933.

Mr. Speaker laid before the House the Report of the Chief Electoral Officer, in conformity with Section 75 of the Dominion Elections Act.

Also his Report of the By-Elections held during the year 1933, pursuant to Subsection 6 of Section 73 of the Dominion Elections Act R.S.C., 1927, Chapter 53.

Mr. Stewart (Leeds) moved, That the House do go into Committee of the Whole, at the next sitting of the House, to consider the following proposed Resolution:—

That, it is expedient to authorize the Minister of Public Works, on behalf of His Majesty, to enter into an agreement with the corporation of the City of Ottawa to extend the period of the existing agreement with the corporation for one year from July 1, 1933.

Whereupon Mr. Stewart (Leeds), a Member of the King's Privy Council, informed the House, That His Excellency the Governor General, having been informed of the subject-matter of the proposed Resolution, recommends it to the House.
