The McGill Graduates' Lectureship .-The Principal referred to the Lectureship made available through the generosity of the McGill Graduates' Society, who had set aside the interest on their Endowment Fund (\$2500), which be sufficient to provide 8 or 10 lectures during the year. These lectures were to be on a similar plan to the Gifford Lectures, and the Principal said that he would welcome suggestions as to possible lecturers, commenting on the notable essay of Professor Eddington on "The Nature of the Physical Universe." Honorary Degrees .-The Principal next brought forward the suggestion to confer an Honorary Degree on General Smuts on the occasion of his visit to Canada on January second next. After a discussion of General Smuts' brilliant career, it was moved by Dr. Martin, seconded by Dean Harrison and carried unanimously that the meeting recommend to the Corporation the conferring of an Honorary Degree on General Smuts.
