

2. The teaching for such a student teacher would have to be arranged in Montreal schools or elsewhere and for this purpose it would be necessary to secure the co-operation of the Montreal Protestant Board of School Commissioners and of its Superintendent. Our experience in the past has proved that such co-operation may be confidently relied upon for worthy causes.

3. The conditions for post graduate work in Scotland are so different ~~in Canadian Universities~~ that it would be necessary for us to examine the regulations of either Glasgow University or Edinburgh University to see what kind of student would be most suitable for sending to Scotland in connection with this scheme.

4. It will be necessary to consider the type of student and the type of teacher and also to consider the possibilities for his employment in a satisfactory way on his return to his native country.

5. We would like to know what kind of teaching the student would be expected to do and what his aim is for his future career.

These are merely some of the questions that occur to me at a first perusal of your memorandum. For your information I am sending herewith a copy of McGill University calendar and also a copy of the announcement of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research.

I would be glad to hear further from you when your proposals are in more definite form and likewise I shall be glad to communicate with you again when we have further information with regard to the McGill end of this interchange.

Meantime, I shall take up this matter with the different Faculties and with the Governors of the institution and you may rest assured that the University appreciates the purpose of your proposals and will do whatever it can to further the success of such inter-imperial schemes.
