The MEMORIAL of JOHN MEARS, Lieutenant in His Majefty's Navy,

Moft humbly flieweth,

THAT early in the year 1786, certain merchants refiding in the East Indies, and under the immediate protection of the Company, defirous of opening a trade with the north-west coast of America, for supplying the Chinese market with furs and ginseng, communicated fuch defign to Sir John Macpherson, the Governor General of India, who not only approved of the plan, but joined in the subscription for its execution; and two vessels were accordingly purchased, and placed under the orders and command of your Memorialist.

That in the month of March your Memorial'ft difpatched one of the faid veffels, which he named The Sea Otter, under the command of Mr. Tipping, to Prince William's Sound, and followed her in the other fhip, which he named The Nootka.

That on your Memorialist's arrival in Prince William's Sound, in the month of September, he found The Sea Otter had left that place a few days before; and, from intelligence he has fince received, the ship was
