HISTORICAL MEMORIES

At one time, under the name of Newark, this town was the capital of the Dominion, and the centre of all the legislative, military and commercial interests. But in the time of strife and warfare it was deemed too close to the American Frontier to be the capital, and the seat of government was, therefore, removed elsewhere. It has the proud distinction of having within its borders some of the oldest churches in

Canada. St. Mark's, Anglican, and St. Andrew's, Presbyterian, are, perhaps, the oldest. St. Mark's was attended by General Brock the Sunday before he went forth to a hero's death at Queenston Heights and in its quiet graveyard there rests the dust of many a soldier who fell at that time dying for his country and his King. St. Mark's parish was founded in 1792, St. Andrew's Church was organized two years later and the Wesleyan Methodists date the organ-
