

SOUTHERN STORMS.

Further Details of the Terrible Visitation and of the Suffering and Loss.

A Harrowing History of Which the Worst is Not Yet Known.

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 6.—A Republic special from New Orleans says: The return of several relief parties sent to the storm-stricken districts of the State fully confirm previous views, and the corrected list puts the total of the dead at 2,941. This may be increased some 500 by subsequent news.

Relief for the sufferers poured in to-day. The city of New Orleans subscribed \$2,500 and the parish of Iberville \$1,000.

NEW ORLEANS, Oct. 6.—In the Pointe à la Pêche country the death list swells to 80, with a prospect of reaching 100 before all are heard from.

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 6.—The relief parties from the Bayou Lafourche and other points in the Gulf coast have returned with reports of a total loss of life in the Bayou Lafourche country of approximately 200.

LOSS OF THE LEONORE. A Well Known South American Vessel Wrecked—Captain Meyers and Wife and Four Seamen Drowned.

PORT TOWNSEND, Oct. 6.—(Special).—The Chilean bark Leonore, from Iquique for Moodyville, to load a return lumber cargo, was wrecked Wednesday morning about three miles north of the Quillay river, on the Washington coast, where she now lies, broken in three pieces, a total loss.

THE COQUILAM JUDGMENT. Cargo Escaping On One Count Forfeited for Another Alleged Violating of Law.

THE JUDGMENT OF THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT at Sitka, in the case of the steamer Coquilam, is as follows: "The vessel is held to be subject to forfeiture under section 2,869 of the Revised Statutes, for receiving cargo within four leagues of the shore at Sitka bay in Alaska, and also, for not reporting such arrival to a customs officer, and unloading cargo without a permit."

WARLIKE MATABELES. Their Attitude Justifies a Declaration of War by the British Government.

CAPE TOWN, Oct. 7.—A dispatch from the front says the Matabeles attacked a patrol of Bechuanaland police near Shasht. The attack was repelled, and after a sharp skirmish the Matabeles fled to the bush. The affair is important from the fact that it is directed against the Imperial forces which are protecting Chief Khama, and also indicates that King Lobengula intends to attack Tati and the country under Government control.
