to-morrow at that of Republicauism--that it appears doubtful whether he means what he writes, or a premeditated hoax upon the public; but I am happy in thus offering my willing testimony, that he never encouraged emigration as a general specific, for the promulgation of his sentiments on that subject where confined to Long Island; and I am inclined to believe his empity to Mr. Birkbeck's specious villainy saved the lives and property of many individuals.

Inoculated with the *mania* of transportation, and, I confess, infatuated with the plausible imposition of delinguent writers, and having a family, which according to the destructive doctrine of such writings, I had the chance of making for a present and future provision, by the application of ordinary industry, inclined me to favor the change : and at this unlucky period my feelings were unhappily and unfortunately wounded by the unmerited and unwarrantable neglect of those who, according to the laws of nature and humanity, and the accepted etiquette of society, I had a right to claim as friends, not to painfully recognize as enemies, this regret gave a decision to the contemplated departure; but the public, I humbly entreat, will allow me to aver, that no political motives had any share, directly or indirectly, with the transfer.

Arrived at Liverpool, a town at once the seat of elegance, opulence, commerce, refinement, industry, and
