Church, was carried, "That whereas a government life saving station on or near the Toronto island has become an absolute necessity, be it therefore resolved that a respectful memorial be presented to the Dominion government urging that the necessary steps be at once taken for the establishment and equipment of an efficient life saving service for duty in the neighborhood of Toronto harbor." 
