

For England.

The Allan royal mail SS, the Parisian leaves Portland April 16 and Halifax April 18 for Liverpool, calling at Moville. The Laurentian, April 28, from Portland, proceeds direct to Liverpool and carries first cabin passengers only. The Mongolian will be the first steamer from Montreal for Liverpool via the St. Lawrence. She will leave Montreal on Saturday, May 2, at daylight, will call at Quebec, 3 p.m., same day, and after embarking passengers will proceed at once to sea, not calling at either Rimouski or Moville. The Mongolian, Numidian and Laurentian will follow this arrangement.

Passengers embark at Montreal on the Friday evening, same as last year.







