A WORD FOR THE OLD HORSE DOCTOR.

A bill has been introduced in the Legis lature to incorporate the veterinary sur geons. The principal clause in the bill reads as follows:

It shall not be lawful for any person, not registered, to practise veter-inary medicine or surgery, or to perform any surgical operation on animals, for hire, gain or hope of reward; and, if any person not registered pursuant to this act, for hire, gain or hope of reward practises. or professes to reward practises, or professes to practise, veterinary medicine or surgery, or advertises to give advice in veterinary medicine or surgery. he shall, upon summary conviction thereof, before any justice of the peace, for each and every such offence, pay a penalty not exceeding \$25, nor less than \$5.






