

The levity of sentiment on the subject is ominous. That which strikes at marriage strikes at the root of social order as well as of personal purity and happiness."

He maintains that marriage as a civil contract should be wholly under the control of the State. The Church should have her rules and her tribunals for enforcing them.

Again he says: "Equally clear does it seem to be that there ought to be one law of marriage and divorce for the whole nation. A nation the United States now are, not a mere federation of sovereign States, tho the nation retains a federal structure. It is against reason that what is marriage in Chicago should be adultery in New York."

In discussing the usual grounds for divorce, he says: "The children have their rightful claims on those who bring them into the world, and they are manifestly injured, morally and socially, by divorce."

His concluding suggestion is: "The law of marriage and divorce ought unquestionably to be, set right, and law when once set right will to some extent rectify sentiment. But sentiment which depends on the general healthiness of society, is after all the ruling force."
