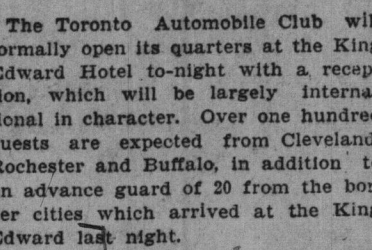

PNEUMATIC TUBES IN FASHION.

**City Adopts New Device Which Toronto Will Install Soon.**

St. Louis has just inaugurated a pneumatic tube system for transmitting mail matter from the various sub-stations to the main post office.

The system was forwarded to and from the Union Station offices at the rate of 120,000 letters per hour each way, or 2,400,000 letters a day for the 24 hours that constitute the working day of the service company.

The system, which is the first of its kind, one-half miles has already been installed in St. Louis, and the system is rapidly being installed in other cities.
