CRIPPEN GIVES BOOKS TO PRISON OFFICIALS

Mementoes From Accused London Physician on Eve of Departure to Stand Trial.

QUEBEC, Aug. 21.—(Special).—Dr. Harvey Hawley Crippen, charged with the murder of his wife, Belle Elmore, in London, England, last January, and arrested on the SS. Montrose at Father Point three weeks ago to-day, as well as Miss Ethel Clara Leneve, arrested with him, left for England last evening on the White Star Line SS. Megantic.

The stay of the couple at the Quebec jail was brought to a sudden termination early Saturday morning, and, in charge of Inspector Dew, Detective Mitchell and two wardresses of Scotland Yard, police headquarters, England, they are now on board the Megantic, which also took on board the Queen's Own regiment of Toronto, and which sailed at 2 p.m.

Dr. Crippen and Miss Leneve were rushed out of the jail to commence their trip to Europe at a few minutes before eight o'clock. Both the prisoners and the prison authorities were kept in absolute ignorance of the preparations for their removal until a little more than half an hour before the doctor and his companion were driven away.

It was shortly after seven o'clock that three closely covered carriages drove up to the jail, and in order to avoid unnecessary publicity, were taken into the courtyard to await the readiness of the prisoners. The preparations of the latter did not take long, for they had already breakfasted. They took time, however, before leaving the prison, to express their gratitude for the manner in which they had been treated there.

Dr. Crippen very delicately asked Governor Morin if he had any objection to accept a small book from him as an expression of his appreciation of the consideration shown him by the governor. Upon Mr. Morin's acceptance, the doctor wrote in pencil on the fly leaf that the book was presented to him by Dr. Crippen, with his compliments and gratitude.

To Mr. Labbe, the guard who had a special charge of Crippen during his incarceration, the doctor presented a copy of Anthony Trollope's "Barchinians Towers," which he wrote in pencil on the title page: "To Mr. M. Labbe, from Dr. H. H. Crippen, with compliments and appreciation of many courtesies."

Mr. Labbe had done many favors for the doctor with the governor's permission, and had purchased him a dozen copies of the series of cheaply bound books to read on the long voyage home, from which the prisoner made the selections of books which he presented to the governor and to Mr. Labbe.

The doctor told the latter in bidding him adieu, that he would hear from him again, no matter what became of his case.

A third book was presented to the governor of the jail, Mrs. Philip, to whom Miss Leneve returned thanks for courtesies shown her.

Both Miss Leneve and Crippen had handkerchiefs laid over their heads to prevent any more photographs being taken of them.

Crippen looked almost happy. It is understood that the party is again sailing under an assumed name. Inspector Dew being registered as Mr. Doyle.

CAUGHT ON THE BRIDGE
Fugitive Without Shoes or Hat Was Easily Trapped.

NIAGARA FALLS, Aug. 21.—A man without shoes or hat attempted to cross the railway steel arch bridge at 2 o'clock this afternoon. He claimed he had lost them, but was arrested and taken to the police station.

The man was allowed to go. When about the centre of the bridge, the telephone asked Provincial Constable McNamara to detain such a man, as he had robbed E. Gadsby of \$50 and a gold watch. The officer promptly phoned the other end of the bridge and the man was returned to this side, where he was promptly arrested and \$35 and watch found on him. It is alleged the man who gave his name as Daniel Linder, "rolled" Gadsby at Queenston, and skipped out.
