### SWEDEN COMES DOWN

Will Meet United States Tariff Re quirements as to Wood Pulp.

NEW YORK, Aug. 21.—The Swed-ish Government has, it is announced, modified the taxation of wood pulp in Sweden to meet the requirements of the Aldrich-Payne tariff act, which imposes a countervailing duty on wood pulp and print paper imported from countries in which an export duty on wood pulp is levied.

By a royal ordinance, the tax, pre-

vicusly paid only upon exported wood pulp the proceeds of which were used for the support of the Swedish Department of Forestry, has been extended to apply to all wood pulp produced in the country. It is expected this change will satisfy the United States customs authorities.
