Uncle Sam's Soldiers Will Play Lacrosse

New York, Dec. 14.—No curtailment of championship lacrosse among the colleges of the country was decided yesterday at the annual meeting of the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse League, held at the Park Avenue Hotel.

On the contrary, the officials of the league and the delegates from the colleges discussed arrangements for a schedule for next year. While nothing definite was done toward formally adopting one, it is expected that this will be attended to shortly.

The leading colleges in the league have all been hit hard by the war, and with this in view, it was decided to introduce the game in the preparatory schools, so that the depleted ranks of college lacrosse players may be restocked. Yale has lost all but one of its lacrosse players.
