A MEATLESS HOT PIE

Another Use Discovered For Those Oxo Cubes.

Here is a recipe calling for no meat other than the concentrated beef-godness to be found in the familiar Oxo cube.

Put back in pie dish with few slices of tomato, season with pepper salt and flavour with herbs. Dissolve one Oxo cube in a pint of hot milk and pour over mixture. Put few bits of butter on top and bake for two hours in moderate oven.

TWO NEW CLAUSES IN HOME RULE BILL. (Continued From Page 1). today subjected to much hostile criticism for evading the task. The government's failure to carry out the Irish parliament would not succeed in drafting a successful scheme.

What Clause Provides. The new clause provides that if the number of members validly elected to either parliament at the first election is less than half the total membership, or if the number who have taken the oath of allegiance within 14 days from the date of the election is less than half, the King may by an order-in-council dissolve such parliament and place the functions of the government in the hands of a committee nominated by the lord lieutenant pending the summoning of a new parliament.

Lord Hugh Cecil criticized the clause as the greatest legislative absurdity ever suggested. Mr. Asquith said the clause was forced into the bill by the character of the southern parliament. The contingency contemplated, he asserted, was that an Irish parliament should be elected which then would be reduced to the condition of the most backward of the crown colonies.
