FENELON FALLS.—The year just closed has been the most prosperous, both financially and spiritually, of our legal term on this Mission. About three months of special services resulted in considerable accessions to the Church, and an advancement in holiness and usefulness in the membership. We have raised for our new church enterprise at the Falls, nearly eight hundred dollars, and in the main the Connexional funds are in advance of former years. The work on the whole Mission is in a prosperous and promising condition. With a membership of 170, most of whom are attending class, and flourishing Sabbath-schools well worked, the future must yield a good harvest and well repay the labourers; then both he that soweth and he that reapeth will rejoice together. DUNSFORD.—Twenty-three were added to the church, but owing to removals, &c., together with the loss of one appointment, which was transferred to an adjoining circuit, our membership stands the same as last year. During the year we organized two new Sabbath-schools upon our denominational basis, which are doing well. MINDEN.—The closing year has been a most laborious one on this field; but marked with much spiritual prosperity. The Spirit's power has been specially felt in its convincing and converting energy. Many dead souls have been quickened into spiritual life and activity, and though we have lost eight by removal and dropped seven for unfaithfulness, still by the blessing of God we are able to report a goodly increase, as thirty-three have been received on trial. Considerable improvement has been made in our church and parsonage property. A comfortable kitchen and cellar have been fitted up, and the inside of our church remodelled, making sittings for thirty or forty more; also seventy feet of picket fence have been built on parsonage lot, and a small shed at an outside appointment, all of which are clear of cost.
