

From the west comes news that Robert A. Gardner of the Hinsdale County Club, national amateur golf champion, is driving as long a ball as ever from the tee, and those who saw him perform at Detroit last year know what that means. Playing at the Omaha Field Club recently he is reported to have driven 355 yards, or within ten yards of a 365-yard green, and to have reached another green 455 yards away with a drive and a mashie-niblick.
