## Shamrocks Win First of Series

### SPORT NEWS OF THE DAY HOME AND ABROAD

#### GOLF.

Drove Ball 355 Yards.  
From the west comes news that Robert A. Gardner of the Hinsdale County Club, national amateur golf champion, is driving as long a ball as ever from the tee, and those who saw him perform at Detroit last year know what that means.

Playing at the Omaha Field Club recently he is reported to have driven 355 yards, or within ten yards of a 365-yard green, and to have reached another green 465 yards away with a drive and a mashie-niblick.  
Some of the western courses become "hard-baked" at this season of the year, and that comes to the rescue of the 365-yard drive of the amateur champion, for eastern golfers are rather skeptical of great drives made somewhere beyond the bounds of civilization, where there may be only thirty inches or so in a yard. On the subject of Gardner's driving, however, a remark made by Gardiner White, himself a long hitter, is "luminating." He said that when he was playing with the amateur champion in the west last year he was being outdistanced so far that he thought his driver was cracked until he looked at the distance markers and found he was driving at his top form.
