PRICES LACKED UNIFORMITY ON N. Y. EXCHANGE

Main Tendency Was Upward With Few Gains

NEW LOW RECORD IS SET BY FRENCH FRANC

Trading in Montreal Today Distributed Over Wide Range of Issues

NEW YORK, May 18.—Price movements lacked uniformity at the opening of today's stock market, but the main tendency appeared to be upward. Initial gains of one to nearly two points were recorded by Woodworth, Dupont, General Electric and Mack Trucks. New low records for all time were established by French francs at 2.87½ cents, and Belgian francs at 2.84½ cents.

MONTREAL, May 18.—Trading on the local stock exchange at the opening this morning was fairly active, and was well distributed in a wide range of issues. Values revealed a strong tendency and gains of a half to three points were recorded. The leaders, Brazilian, Power and Smelters, were strong, the former being up an eighth at 95, Power up a half at 254, and Smelters up one point

at 192. Other strong spots included Sherwin Williams up three at 128, Asbestos up two at 102, and Steamships preferred up a half at 48. Winnipeg Gains was soft, ending a point at 47.

300-Year Old Elevator Is Discovered

LONDON, May 18.—A smuggler's den containing an elevator dated 1644 has been discovered at Dover. The den was revealed during inspection of a block of old houses on the Commercial Quay in connection with proposed housing improvements. The house is four stories high, and the elevator went from the basement on the water level to the top of the building. Hidden behind "cushion" walls it is still in working order, and there is every indication that the place was at one time used as a smuggler's collecting house.

NEW YORK, May 18.—Clark Childs—The market's technical position seems strong though this is always one of the least important of indicators. Hornblower—"Speculative sentiment of the bullish variety has been so definitely undermined that it is practically useless to expect anything more in the immediate future than technical rallies brought about by an over-sold condition of the market. Withhold from selling stocks in periods of extreme weakness. Fenner and Beane—"The market appears to be reaching the over-sold state and from a technical standpoint ought to rally. Bache & Co.—"Technically, the market presents a somewhat over-sold condition, and for a turn, conservative purchases are suggested during the day."

VILLAGERS REPORT SEEING A GHOST

Hooded Figure Seen in Lanes, Causes Alarm in English Towns

LONDON, May 18.—A black, hooded figure, which stalks in a lonely lane, has been causing some alarm and no little excitement in the villages of Garton and Dogsthorpe, near Peterborough. The apparition has been seen by several responsible persons during the past fortnight, and younger inhabitants are now indoors at dusk, while even older people are somewhat nervous of using the lane after nightfall. Charles Johnson, of Cherry Tree House, has seen the ghost on three occasions recently. About 10 o'clock at night he was walking in the lane, when suddenly, right in front of him, appeared a black hooded figure, five feet in height. The hood came right to the ground and the figure seemed to glide along noiselessly. He said later: "I had a heavy stock with me and as the apparition went through the hedge I struck the spot but hit nothing. I saw it again the following night, and it disappeared in a similar manner. On Monday night, accompanied by my brother-in-law and sister-in-law, I was returning home just before 10 o'clock. They were walking 12 yards in front of me when the black hooded figure appeared apparently from nowhere, and walked by their side for a distance of 30 yards. I whistled to call their attention, and they immediately turned round, whilst the figure glided across the road just behind them, passing through the hedge at the same spot as before, and vanished."
