THE METAL MARKET

In its summary of the iron, steel, metal and machinery markets for week ended Sept. 26, Canadian Machinery and Manufacturing News, Toronto, makes the following observations: For the first time in many months it is safe to say that there are signs of a little improvement in some marketing conditions. The plate situation, which has been almost hopeless, shows signs of improving. And the Canadian shipment of material from United States points has been increased by enough tonnage to make the difference noticeable. The shippers look to the government for their supplies now. Mills at the big producing points in Canada States have been concentrating on plates for some months, and the result is that there are indications of the demand being overhauled.

Coupled with this was the drafting of men from the depot battalions for the service in Siberia, and arrangements for uniforming and equipping such men.

Frenchman Who Died 20 Years Ago Left Reward for His Recapture.

Philadelphia, Sept. 27.—The first French soldier to plant his flag in the city of Strassburg will receive \$541.43 or more from the will of a French patriot who died in this city twenty years ago.
