In the absence of news of a more satisfactory nature, the war correspondents and of boys of sixteen and seventeen years are found in the German trenches; that the Germans have lost men in tens of thousands; that their officers appear crazed with mortification; that the troops are disheartened, and that they were deceived with assurances that they were close to Paris and would soon be in that city.

CHILDREN'S AID

There is still no news from Russia to encourage the belief that the Russian army is making any more satisfactory progress than the armies of France and Britain.

The release of the American tank steamer which had been seized by British cruisers has settled a vexed question, now it is likely to be any serious difficulty between Britain and the United States over the question of German and Austrian reservists.

One fact which should appeal with great force to all Canadians is the condition of the Belgian people, who are now on the very verge of famine. The Belgian army is still fighting with conspicuous bravery in that corner of the country to which it has been driven, but all over the kingdom the sufferings of the people are great, and daily growing more terrible.

Lord Charles Berezford says that the serious time of the war will begin when the Germans have been forced over the frontier into their own country and with their own supplies.

It would be to the advantage of East St. John to become incorporated with the city. There is likely to be fairly rapid growth in that suburb, and it would be in the interests of the whole community to have the boundaries of the city extended.

Efforts to establish the boy scout movement in St. John have thus far not met with as much success as they deserve. Apparently the greatest difficulty has been to get qualified and enthusiastic scout masters.

The shipbuilding record for the Penobscot River and Bangor district will be practically a blank for 1914, with the exception of a few small sloops and power boats.

THE KARLSRUHE. The cruiser Karlsruhe, a ship of a trifle less than 5,000 tons, has had in this war a career as eventful in the Atlantic as that of her smaller sister ship, the Emden, in the Indian Ocean.

The Karlsruhe first came into notice at the outbreak of the war when she appeared in the vicinity of Sandy Hook, apparently in wait for British merchantmen leaving New York.

On August 9 the Karlsruhe appeared in the harbor of San Juan, P. R., where she sailed and then again took to the sea. Soon after it was learned that the Karlsruhe had been driven away by the approach of several British cruisers.

It appears that the British cruisers came unexpectedly upon the Karlsruhe while she was coaling from the German steamer Kroppings Wilhelm.

The Karlsruhe is a comparatively new ship, having gone into commission early in 1913. She is very fast, having a speed of twenty-seven knots, which has enabled her thus far to elude successfully the persistent British pursuit.
