EX OFFICERS OF THE BRITISH REGULAR AND TERRITORIAL FORCES

The Canadian military authorities have received through the governor general an important notification from the Army Council, London, regarding the mobilization of ex-officers of the British regular and territorial forces.

The Army Council have reason to believe that there are several ex-officers of the regular army and territorial forces between twenty-five and forty years of age residing in Canada who have not joined the Canadian contingent, but who would join their old corps. The Army Council are prepared to offer such persons, including retired officers of the special reserve and ex-militia officers if certified medically fit, temporary commissions for the duration of the war. Free passage to and from Great Britain and an allowance of thirty pounds sterling made for provision of uniform and one of seven pounds ten shillings for

LIMITED MORATORIUM PROPOSED FOR ONTARIO

While Mr. Justice Kelly declined on Wednesday to disallow the application for a foreclosure in a mortgage case on the grounds that the moratorium legislation which will be passed at the next session of the house, it would seem that the judgment will have very little effect on the case. After an order for foreclosure is given, as in the case before Mr. Justice Kelly, proceedings cannot be completed until six months' interval has elapsed. By that time the Ontario Legislature will have met, and the moratorium law will be on the statute books. It is possible that argument will be offered that the foreclosure order given by Mr. Justice Kelly does not come within the range of the moratorium law as it was issued prior to the passing of the act.

ter, the Hon. I. B. Lucas, provincial treasurer, returned to the statement issued by the government some time ago. The statement follows:—

"It is the intention of the government at the next session of the legislature to introduce an act requiring mortgages, holders of agreements of sale, options, and other like securities to secure an order from a judge before taking proceedings, either through the court or otherwise, to foreclose or forfeit such mortgages or securities for default in payment of principal; and giving judges power, upon a proper case being made out, to relieve from foreclosure and to extend the time for payment of principal moneys."

"It is not intended by this proposed legislation to in any way interfere with rent, interest, or other payments of this character, or in any case where a judge does not feel that justice and right demand that some relief be given."

"It is the intention of the government to make such legislation retro-active, and the judges and the legal profession are particularly requested to make note of the proposed legislation and of this fact."
